Organizers Postpone Annual Event

(Detroit, MI) - The giant ceremonial "D" won't drop in downtown Detroit Dec. 31 to welcome the New Year -- but organizers of the event say that's a good thing. Nine years ago, a group of young entrepreneurs teamed up to create a version of New York's famed New Year's Eve Times Square celebration for Detroit, designing a free public event that would draw attention to the revitalization of the city.

With the support of friends in marketing and event production as well as the business community, Jerrid Mooney and Tony Piraino founded *Motor City New Year's Eve: The DROP*. The event was an immediate hit generating extensive publicity that brought thousands of people to celebrate the city's resurgence at The "D" Drop.

"Be careful what you wish for" as the saying goes. Since its inception, the event's success and the public's desire to celebrate in a now-bustling Detroit have grown exponentially.

"We launched The DROP in 2009 to draw attention to the city's mounting revival," says Mooney. "Now, downtown is so awash with activity that event logistics and timing for our ever-growing celebration became an issue. We feel focusing on MCNYE 2020 will allow us to maintain and surpass our high standards."

Offering the public a premium entertainment experience, in a fun, safe environment are the guiding principles for The DROP says Mooney. "We want to create lasting memories and look forward to exceeding expectations next year."
